Secretary of Agriculture Opinions

- Richard Lyng, 1986
 - “We must be so completely dedicated to an antidiscrimination policy that when the slightest hint of discrimination shows up it is quickly spotted and eliminated as a glaring inconsistency.”
- Ed Madigan, 1992
 - “Thank you for your recent letter to Secretary Madigan concerning the right to migrate freely throughout the world.”
 - “The United States supports the international recognition of the right of free immigration. This is one of several issues that is being negotiated as part of the general trade talks...”

Equal Employment Opportunity

- Benefits of EEO
 - More efficient economy
 - Greater incentive to learn new skills
 - EEO actually implies Greater Opportunity
 - It just seems fair
 - Very similar to free trade
- Disadvantages
 - More competition for jobs
 - Jobs like hunting and fishing no longer profitable

Equal Employment Opportunity

- Remaining hurdles
 - About 7 billion people remain legally unequal
 - Foreigners must get permission to be equal
 - Noncitizens have No Opportunity in U.S. government
 - Living and working can be a crime (illegal aliens)
 - All people need equal opportunity
 - United Nations too weak to enforce EEO



EEO: Who Needs It?

- Only Americans, of course
- Foreigners don't need jobs (or places to live)
- U.S. government makes us discriminate
- **Proposed new rule:**
 - *People are People, Equal is Equal*

Agriculture: Who Needs It?

- We have too much food in the U.S.
- We have too few consumers in the U.S.
- **Where are the consumers?**
 - *They are locked out of the U.S.*

Agricultural Efficiency

- Source: Food and Agriculture Organization Production Yearbook, **2023**
 - 28 nations were included
 - Each had >1% of world's people or >1% of farmland
 - Imports or exports were not credited
 - 1 hectare = 2.47 acres, 1 person = 1 person
- World Statistics, **2023**
 - $(8.05 \text{ billion people}) / (1.58 \text{ billion hectares of farmland}) =$
 - 5.1 people / hectare
 - 2.1 people / acre

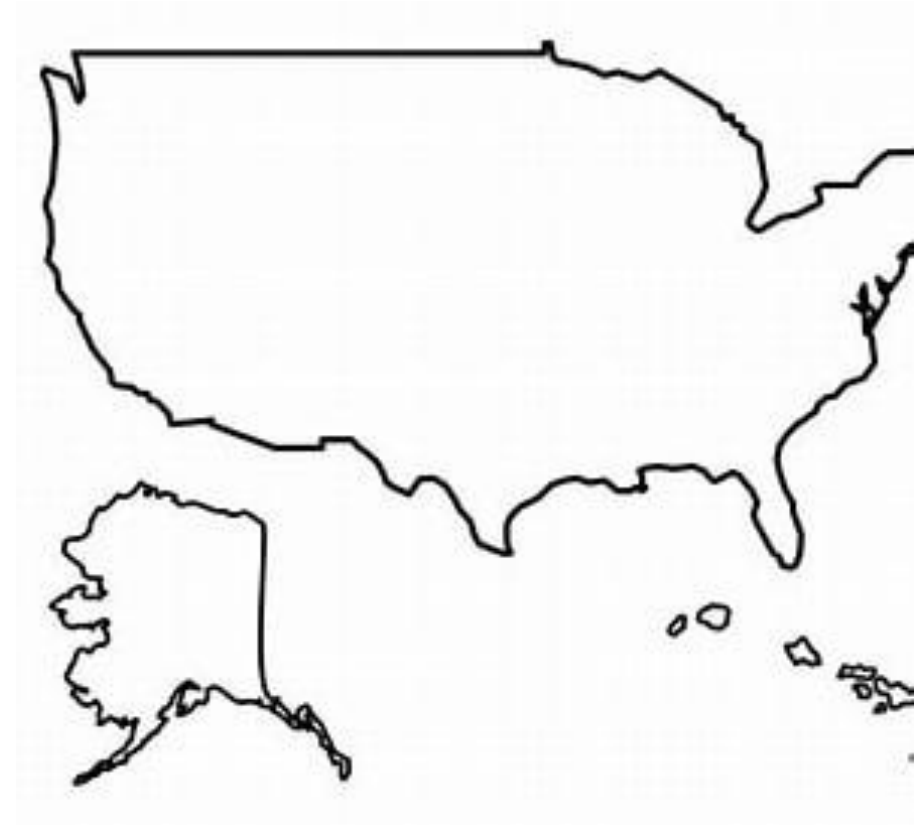

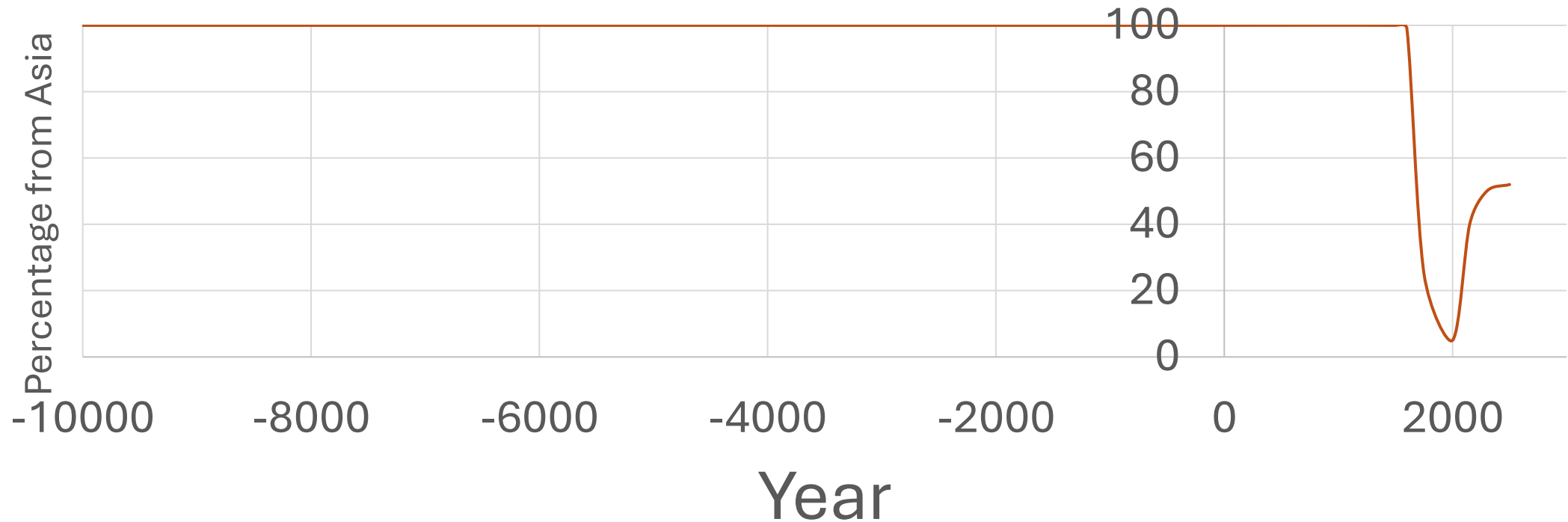
